When David and Lee began in ministry it was with Haven of Hope in Philadelphia. Their objective was to be a place where the Gospel is presented boldly, and women imprisoned by drug addictions can have a new life through faith, hope, and strength in Jesus Christ.

Moving on from there David worked at World **Evangelization for Christ** (WEC) headquarters in Fort Washington, PA. WEC helps local churches strategically focus their mission and ministry. They develop partnerships with missionaries in the field. recruits missionaries, and sends out short-term teams. It was while working here that David and Lee gained a desire to see the people of Morocco reached with the message of Jesus.

Feeling a calling from the Lord to use his gifts and talents to help evangelize and disciple, David is

currently serving as a pastor of a congregation consisting of mostly sub-Saharan African Christians in the country of Morocco. Lee, his wife, is also working with the church in discipleship and women's ministries.

David: "We ask that you pray for us to be able to visit the new attendees of our church: It's hard to fit in all that we have to do. Pray also for the deepening of the spiritual lives of our leaders and that they will resist the huge temptations that are constantly in their face. Pray for the continued progress on the sanctuary enlargement and that we can learn who to go to get the authorization. Please continue to pray for a hunger and thirst for the Word of God by our

church members. At times. it seems like they are mainly interested in miracles, supernatural manifestations and "prosperity" more than the Giver Himself. Lastly, pray that God will draw those who are in the peripheral of the church family into a vibrant relationship with Him."

## Monthly Updates

### An Update from the Pastor...

Hi church! I was having a conversation with someone recently where they shared how their church had integrated new technology into the service. They were describing the TV screens, Artificial Intelligence, and other high-tech elements they have started using. And while I would never speak down about a church "being all things to all people" (as Paul said), it did make me think; is there such a thing as "too much?"

The answer to that question is, I believe, yes. Where the line is will change depending on the circumstance but, yes, there is such a thing as "too much." We need to be careful when introducing anything into the church that may prevent or interfere with relationships. After all, the word "church" means a gathering of people – not a production of activities. We do

not gather to simply observe a show put on by a few, but rather to create and develop relationships with God and others. So, any time a mechanical instrument takes over a task a person once performed, we need to be cautious.

So, with all of this in mind, we will be doing some things that provide better connection and more opportunities to serve.

One thing will be asking for volunteers to hand out bulletins to those entering the sanctuary. It is one thing to pick one up from a podium, but it is another

to personally receive something from someone welcoming you. If you would like to help with this, please speak with one of our pastors. We will be looking to make this change within the next several weeks.

In a world racing towards individualism and disconnection, the church remains the place where people still come together and serve one another, and that is something no amount of technology can replace.

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

- We are well into the winter months and continue to praise the Lord for the beauty that winter weather brings. With that, we do ask that you bear with us as our heating system works non-stop to keep the building comfortable. We realize that certain rooms may be slightly cooler than others and may require a sweater or jacket. Being proactive in these measures can help us keep heating costs down during the extreme cold.
- We need more space for the youth and other activities that currently take place in the school, on the lower level, and in the fellowship hall. Please pray for God to open a door of provision for this need.
- The driveway entrances near the main road need to be repaired. This

- has been discussed and we are looking to have those done as soon as possible, weather dependent.
- Our library needs updating to meet the needs of the people using the room. Since the room is not used as a library anymore and is instead used for meetings, classes, and Bible studies, the idea is to update it to fit those needs. The plan is to keep books needed by the church and have a book fair at some point to allow people from the church a chance to purchase books from the library collection, with the rest being donated. The room will then be worked on to provide more seating and table space, technology resources and tools, and other things needed for that kind of space.

My yearning to cultivate a deeper relationship with ABBA by sharing His scripture with the next generation is the very essence of my heartfelt service. This conviction, gently placed in my soul by the Holy Spirit before my journey to Shepherd of the Hills Calvary Chapel, began with my own children. By imparting these sacred texts to them, I aspire to nurture their personal connection with our Heavenly Father. It lays a sturdy foundation upon which they will stand throughout life's journey, illuminating who God is, what He has done for them, and defining who He says they are. My intention is to share God's word deliberately, reflecting the profound love and grace that Yeshua has shown me. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

## "Trading My Sorrows"

Sing praises to the Lord, O you his saints, and give thanks to his holy name. For his anger is but for a moment, and his favor is for a lifetime. Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning." – Psalm 30:4-5

One of my favorite songs to lead in worship is "Trading My Sorrows" by Darrell Evans. It's a classic modern worship song from the late 90's that is just as relevant to the believer today as it was when it was published. Taking inspiration from Psalm 30 where David is praising the Lord at the dedication of the house of David (his palace), the song reflects on the goodness and grace of God amid adversity.

As we head into the new year, no doubt many of us are praying for relief from adversity. The previous year brought many challenges and trials, and 2025 will come with its own challenges and trials. But we know that no matter what we face, God is able to use every circumstance for good to accomplish His purpose (Romans 8:28). Even though we may be pressed, but not crushed, persecuted, but

never abandoned (2 Corinthians 4:8-10), let us continually say "Yes, Lord, yes Lord, Yes, yes Lord!" – Yes, to God's will for our lives as we continue on in 2025.

## Spiritual Care:

Being Still in the Pressing

In this month's spiritual care message, we explore the importance of being still during times of pressing. The recent Sunday messages largely reminded us of God's sovereignty in the suffering. Rather than addressing why an all-knowing God allows suffering, I want to share a powerful position we can take: being still and knowing that He is God (Psalm 46:10)

This scripture, written by an unknown Jew to their fellow Israelites, reminds them of God's sovereignty during their enslavement and persecution by the Babylonians. The verse encourages them to be still, trusting that God will use their suffering to complete His plan. While their enslavement was a period of hardship, it ultimately led to their prosperity, strengthened faith and dependence on God, contributing to their spiritual growth and renewal.

Suffering often leads to self-

preservation behaviors like anger and doubt. These reactions can cause more pain. The Israelites likely felt these emotions during their captivity but were reminded to be still. Practicing stillness helps us trust the Lord and place our burdens in His capable hands. If you are feeling anxious, spend time in prayer, asking the Lord to help you be still to his voice. Read Psalm 46 and ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate its meaning in your heart. Trusting in God during hardships will lead to a deeper understanding and reliance on Him, strengthening your faith and guiding you through life's pressing challenges.

- Books about Jesus: Sum up Jesus Life John 3:16-17

- Dear Pastor: Church division over leaders 1 Corinthians 1:10-17

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: Continuing in Series "Unleash Your Superpowers" (Downstairs Classrooms)

When we fill our hearts and minds with God's Word, we are given, by the Holy Spirit, a whole slew of our own unbeatable superpowers. The kids will end the month with a new series titled, "Opposite Day".

The "Opposite Day" series is Radical Wisdom from the Sermon on the Mount. This series focuses on the Beatitudes found in Matthew Chapter 5. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gives us a picture of how we are to live, love and treat other people, that was radically different from the wisdom of his day... and today. Sometimes God's way is opposite from our way.

- Flight: Trust, Isaiah 40:28-31
- Invisibility: Love, Mtthew 25:31-46
- Replication: Tell, Acts 1:4-11
- Beatitudes: Me Attitudes, Matthew 5:1-12

Sunday School 5th and 6th Grade: Continuing in the Series on the Festivals of Old Testament and how they point to Jesus in the New Testament

- Lent, Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter
- The Feast Weeks (Shavuot and Pentecost)
- Festival of Trumpets (Rosh Hashanah) Good Friday and Easter recap
- Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur)

Please keep our church family, pastors, teachers and children lifted up in prayer. As always, we look forward to spending time with your children, learning more about our Great God and the plans and promises He has for all of us.

Wednesday Evening Ministry - 6:30-8:30: H2O Kids - Drop off at the Fellowship Hall

Sign in your children, Kindergarten through 5th Grade. at the Fellowship Hall. All children start the evening with games, a skit and worship to our Great God. After that, we split into K-2 and 3-5th grades for a Bible Study Lesson, a small group discussion and a craft.

"BUGS" Continuing in the series, "Little Things Make a Big Difference." Scripture Inspiration Psalm 19:1 "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands"

- Firefly: Matthew 5:13-16, Salt and Light. In the summertime, there is nothing that lights up the night sky like fireflies. God want us to be his light in this world, so others can see Jesus
- Grasshoppers: Genesis 19:12-29, Lot flees from Sodom and Gomorrah: No bug is harder to catch than the grasshopper. When they see trouble, they jump to safety. God wants us to flee from temptation.
- Roly Poly: 2 Chronicles 20:1-30, Jehoshaphat leads Judah to Victory: When the Roly Poly gets spooked, he rolls into a little ball and often gets batted around! God doesn't want us to hide in fear, but to trust Him and be brave.
- Praying Mantis: Luke 18:19-14, Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector: The praying Mantis only looks like he is praying to God; he's actually looking for something to eat! God wants us to be people who genuinely pray and seek Him, everyday!




