Are you interested in serving here at Shepherd of the Hills? Here are just a few areas that have an active need.

WE'RE HIRING! A Part-time (Salaried, 32 hours) Ministry Assistant. Mon-Thurs: 9:00 am – 4:00 pm; Friday: 9:00 am – 1:00 pm. This position consists of primarily office work, conducted at a desk. While some tasks will require walking, standing, crouching, and lifting (<25 lbs.), most work will be done from a seated position. The Ministry Assistant shall be responsible for the overall management and administration of the church office. S/He will also serve in a simultaneous capacity as the Sr. Pastor's administrative assistant. Due to the nature of the ministry, this position requires a high degree of confidentiality and as such the person selected must be trustworthy and honest. December Missions

The Stokes family lives in the mountains of Papua Indonesia amongst a people group named the “Dem.” They are an isolated people group that have no written form of their language, never had any western influences and are completely remote. The only way in or out if by using a small missionary plane or their feet.

They have completed the translation of the Bible into the native language and have taught their first round of over 80 lessons of the Gospel. They have experienced several hundred native Dem coming to listen each day.

Currently the Stokes cannot return to the tribe at this time due to tribal fighting, but are training natives in a neighboring village.

Where they live there is no power company, no water company, no roads or corner mini mart. They live off solar panels, water from a stream and the trip to the

grocery store is a plane landing with a couple months’ worth of food.

“We are Jeremiah & Briana Stokes. We have 3 children Eden Jericho and Noelle and we are missionaries with New Tribes Mission in Indonesia.

We moved overseas July 4, 2010. We are both from Pennsylvania but opposite sides of the state. Briana is from eastern Pa and Jeremiah is from Pittsburgh. We both grew up in Christian homes but when we were in our first year of college, we were confronted with the fact that there are unreached tribal people groups that have no access to the Bible.”

An Update from the Pastor...



Hi everyone! I hope this finds you blessed and well. We are in the Christmas season right now which means we are in one of the most exciting times of the year. There is a lot that happens during these weeks and a lot to prepare for, so please remember to pray for all the ministry that takes place in December.

I also want to encourage us all to pause and remember the real 'reason for the season:' that Jesus Christ was born into the world to offer hope to the hopeless, and salvation to the lost. It is great to decorate the homes and have gatherings and give gifts, just keep in mind the reason we do, why it is special.

Someone once asked me why Christians should celebrate Christmas the way we do since Jesus was not born in December,

the wise men were practicing astrology (something condemned in scripture), pine trees do not grow in Israel and decorating them comes from paganism. They mentioned the Christmas season is more filled with worldly traditions than it is of the celebrations of the early church. To which I replied, they were right! Jesus was likely born around the Spring, based on historical evidence. It is also correct that decorating

pine trees comes from European history, not Israelite. Also, the wise men did not worship God – they followed the stars.

And yet God, in His sovereignty, was able to change the meaning of all that from something that celebrated paganism to something that celebrated His Son! And so now, every year on December 25th, the entire world recognizes and even worships the birth of Jesus Christ. We truly serve an awesome God!

Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

- The roof project has been completed! This fall we were able to finish replacing the roof over the offices, school rooms, and fellowship hall areas. The roof over the foyer and bookstore had been done a few years ago, so we are done with this project for now. Thank you to everyone who helped with this!
- Glen Moyer, who served as our property maintenance employee, has moved on to other things to be closer to family near his home. We thank him for his help over the past year and his volunteer service the year before that. Beginning in January we will be welcoming Lee Rufe to our staff as a part-time maintenance supervisor. Lee will help us keep the building and the grounds in good working order.
- We need more space for the youth and other activities that currently take place in the school, on the lower level, and in the fellowship hall. Please pray for God to open a door of provision for this need.
- The driveway entrances near the main road need to be repaired. This has been discussed and we are looking to have those done as soon as possible, weather dependent.
- Our library needs updating to meet the needs of the people using the room. Since the room is not used as a library anymore and is instead used for meetings, classes, and Bible studies, the idea is to update it to fit those needs. The plan is to keep books needed by the church and have a book fair at some point to allow



people from the church a chance to purchase books from the library collection, with the rest being donated. The room will then be worked on to provide more seating and table space, technology resources and tools, and other things needed for that kind of space.

- For the past couple of years, we have had a kind of mower shortage with several machines needing repair. However, a member of the church has donated several machines and made repairs on the ones we had, so that now we have more mowers than before. Thank you to all who have helped in that! MUSIC MOMENTS “Lay Me Down”



Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.” – John 15:13

“What does it mean when we sing ‘Lay Me Down?’” – I had someone ask me this question one Sunday in response to one of the song choices of the morning: “Lay Me Down” by Chris Tomlin. I explained that Lay Me Down is a call to surrender to Christ. The third verse of the song states that we are “letting go of our pride, giving up all our rights.” The verse then ends with a plea: “take this life and let it shine.” The individual understood after I finished explaining the meaning of the song, but it made me realize something: perhaps the message of a given song is not as obvious to others as it is to all of us serving as worship leaders.

After all, what is a song? In most cases, a song is poetry, written to a given melody, tempo, and cadence. Over the centuries the style of poetry and melody has shifted and changed. Every year it seems there are new ways to express the truth of God through song and poetry; and this is good! Psalm 96 urges us to “sing to the LORD a new song” – a song not burdened by dull routine or obligation but sung fresh from a heart desperate to draw close to God. A song that leads us to say, “it will be my joy to say, Your will, Your way.” That song is one worth singing in our daily praise.

Spiritual Care: Thankfulness and Anxiety

Anxiety steals our joy, and we forget just how good God is. This past November we learned that a heart full of thankfulness and praise is the spiritual key to truly managing anxiety. This focus is not a call to ignore the hardship of life. It is to make an active choice to remind ourselves that God is in control. His peace is found when we take our eyes off the worries and place them on Him.

Take a moment to read Philippians 4:4-9. Notice that the imprisoned Paul calls us to praise the Lord. In the act of worship, we are reminded that the God we serve is greater than our fears. Paul then reminds us to focus on God's goodness. When we make the active choice to recognize the Lord's blessings, even in difficult times, we are reminded just how good the Lord is. A heart that is full of

thankfulness and praise is a heart that will be less anxious.

Take time today and listen to a worship song. Create a list of all the blessings you see God doing even in the struggle. Bring your worries and concerns to the Lord in prayer. You will begin to feel his peace rest upon you even in the difficult times.

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT



"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth!
Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into
His presence with singing!"

Psalm 100:1-2

Isaiah 12:5 says; "Sing praises to the Lord, for he has done gloriously; let this be made known in all the earth." Worship music is an important element in every worship service; joining with other believers to sing praises to our Lord and savior.
