

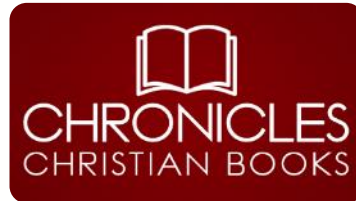

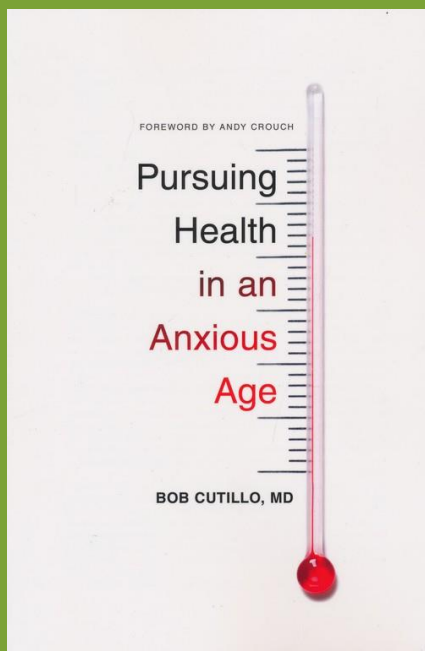

March Missions

After his conversion to Christianity in 1971 Bob became affiliated with Jews for Jesus in 1979. He is the leader of Jews for Jesus Austral/Asia, a territory which now includes Singapore and New Zealand as well. He lives in Sydney with his wife.

Bob travels throughout the world sharing the message of Messiah Y'shua. He has preached or ministered on the streets in Korea, New Zealand, Singapore, Argentina, visited 47 of the 50 states in the US, all over the traps in Australia from Perth to Townsville to Melbourne to Port Macquarie. Not only is Bob's style winsome, but his message of faith in Jesus is powerful.

Bob is also the creator and director of Project Timothy, an international messianic internship and discipleship program for young adults from 18-25.

Bob Mendelsohn is our Missions Commitment focus for the month of March. Bob currently serves in Sydney, Australia with Jews for Jesus.

"I had always been proud to be Jewish. There was some mystique to all these dos and don'ts that were supposed to improve me as a person and, in particular, as a Jew. I was fervent, not so much about God, but about "doing" Judaism correctly. It was my job, as a Jew, to observe these commands and comply. I figured that even if there were no God, it couldn't hurt to comply. Yet hard as I tried, I always seemed to fall short; there was always something more to do, or not do.

In my early twenties I found myself in a conversation with a pair of street corner preachers. Their education was limited but their faith was genuine. The person of Jesus was very appealing.

The New Testament was a defensible book; the gospel was a defensible story. As I found myself drawn to Jesus I began asking myself, how could I do this? How could I be Jewish and believe in Jesus? It seemed like such a paradox."

MARCH MISSIONS Vision Project

Luke and Alyssa Miller are our Missions Vision Project for the month of March.

Luke and Alyssa have been called to serve with Prosperous Youth Foundation in Chiang Mai, Thailand. They serve, disciple, and teach in Chiang Mai's youth homes for at risk youth from ages 12-20.



Many of these youth come from tribal families who live in mountain villages, hours from schools, so they move to the city for an education while their parents stay in the village to work their farms. There is great need for this kind of ministry for the youth to have more adult interaction and to be guided and introduced to Christ.

The potential outcomes are invaluable: decreased drug use, prostitution, poverty and high school drop-outs and a generation who knows Christ and has hope for the future!

Another thing we are looking forward to is the annual service day in April. We will be getting some needed things done around the property. In past years this has involved indoor cleaning and

purging, outdoor maintenance, seeding lawns, mulching playgrounds, and other things like that. It is definitely a great time of service, and all the help makes things go much more smoothly. So, if you could be in prayer about these things, it would be great!

I also wanted to thank everyone who has been tuning in to our weekly prayer updates and praying with us. There is a lot of prayer needed in the church and knowing you are praying too helps!

Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

- We are looking forward to our service day in April (Saturday, April 5th). Typically, these days involve working around and on the church property. Things like seeding grass, pulling weeds, mulching playgrounds and flower beds, machinery maintenance, cleaning the building, purging unneeded items, cleaning carpets, and the like are the types of tasks needed on that day. So, if you can help, it would be greatly appreciated.
- Our baptistry fountain will be reopened as soon as the weather permits (which means the temperature stays above freezing overnight). Last year one of our Connect Groups graciously donated the money to purchase some benches to place near

the baptistry. The idea is, people can sit by the waterfall and enjoy the sound of the water, pray, talk, and otherwise enjoy the area. These benches will likely be purchased soon and placed when the weather warms up.

- We need more space for the youth and other activities that currently take place in the school, on the lower level, and in the fellowship hall. Please pray for God to open a door of provision for this need.
- The driveway entrances near the main road need to be repaired. This has been discussed and we are looking to have those done as soon as possible, weather dependent.



- Our library needs updating to meet the needs of the people using the room. Since the room is not used as a library anymore and is instead used for meetings, classes, and Bible studies, the idea is to update it to fit those needs. The plan is to keep books needed by the church and have a book fair later this month to allow people from the church a chance to take home books from the library collection, with the rest being donated. The room will then be worked on to provide more seating and table space, technology resources and tools, and other things needed for that kind of space.

Thank you all for your continued help and support! Please pray for our volunteers who help with the property and please consider serving in this area if you are able!

My yearning to cultivate a deeper relationship with ABBA by sharing His scripture with the next generation is the very essence of my heartfelt service. This conviction, gently placed in my soul by the Holy Spirit before my journey to Shepherd of the Hills Calvary Chapel, began with my own children. By imparting these sacred texts to them, I aspire to nurture their personal connection with our Heavenly Father. It lays a sturdy foundation upon which they will stand throughout life's journey, illuminating who God is, what He has done for them, and defining who He says they are. My intention is to share God's word deliberately, reflecting the profound love and grace that Yeshua has shown me. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

MUSIC MOMENTS "Goodness of God"

Oh, that men would give thanks to the Lord for His goodness, and for His wonderful works to the children of men! For He satisfies the longing soul, and fills the hungry soul with goodness." – Psalm 107:8-9

Have you ever thought about what it means when we say God is good? There are numerous verses in the Bible that mention the goodness of God. Many of the songs that we sing in corporate worship remind us of the goodness of God. The word "good" itself can mean different things depending on how it is used. As an adjective it can mean "to be desired or approved of." As a noun it can mean "what is morally right, or righteous." And certainly God is all these things, but I think more importantly, it is just as true to say, "God is good simply because He is God."

So when we sing a song that says "Your goodness is running after, it's running after me" – we're reminding ourselves that God Himself is by our side, running after us, sustaining us in our ministry. When we come to Him and surrender our lives to His will, He will never leave our side, even through the most difficult trials and storms. "All my life You have been faithful. All my life You have been so, so good." Let us never stop singing about the goodness of God.



Spiritual Care: God's Love & The Prodigals Son

Luke 15:11-32. Knowing God's love can be profoundly comforting when we feel unloved, as illustrated by the Prodigal Son. The son, after squandering his inheritance, returns expecting rejection but is met with his father's unconditional love, representing God's forgiveness and acceptance. This parable teaches that God's love for his children is constant, regardless of our mistakes or the love we receive from others. His is an unchanging love because we are his children. Like the prodigal son, we only need to turn and go back to our father.

When we feel isolated or unworthy, remembering this story can remind us of a divine and unchanging love that seeks us out in our vulnerability. This can heal the wounds of human rejection, reinforcing that our value isn't contingent on others' approval but on God's love for us.

Understanding this love can combat feelings of worthlessness

and loneliness, key factors in mental health struggles. It encourages self-compassion as we begin to see ourselves as God sees us. God's love reduces anxiety and bolsters emotional resilience.

To deepen your connection with God's love, practice daily prayer or meditation, focusing on gratitude for His love. Reflect on moments you've felt this love or simply sit in silence, inviting His love in by trusting his word. This can help manage mental health by reinforcing your inherent worth and lovability as God's child.

Sunday Morning Kids Ministries:

8:00 AM Service: Kids are dismissed following the Good News Mystery Box to the Children's Room for a Bible lesson followed by fellowship and play.

9:30 AM Service: Kids are encouraged to attend our Sunday School for all ages for the whole 9:30-10:30 AM hour. We also have childcare for infants and toddlers.

11:00 AM Service: Kids are dismissed following the Good News Mystery Box to Children's Church and Care Room

Due to the snow in February, we are behind one week in our lessons. No worries though, we will continue as we have planned, completing the lessons and teaching about our Great God, the love He has for us, His promises and character, that never waivers, because He is faithful.

Preschool - Kindergarten Sunday School: Series Scripture: 2 Timothy 3:16 (Meets upstairs in PreK Classroom)

The Series the children are continuing their study, "Books of the Bible". The goal is to have the children learn and say the 66 Books of the Bible, by implementing simple hand motions, along with the lessons, skits, crafts, songs and games. They will be learning the following this month:

- Dear Pastor: Church division over leaders, 1 Corinthians 1:10-17
- Paul's Pen Pals: Paul's letters to friends, Timothy, Titus, Philemon & the Thessalonians
- Heaven Sounds Awesome: A New Heaven and Earth, Revelation 21:1-7
- Route 66: Having the Mind of Christ, Philippians 2:1-11

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: Continuing in Series "Unleash Your Superpowers" (Downstairs Classrooms)

We will start a new series this month, "Opposite Day". Radical Wisdom from The Sermon on the Mount. This series gives us a picture of how Jesus wants us to live, love and treat other people, which was radically different from the wisdom of his day...and today. Sometimes God's way is opposite of our way.

- Beatitudes, Me-Attitudes: Beatitudes, "With God, I can find joy in any circumstance. Matt 5:1-12
- Eyes on the Prize: Eye for an Eye, "With God I can go the extra mile". Matt 5:38-42
- Perfection, No Biggie: Love your Enemies, "With God, I can show love to ALL people. Matt 5:43-48
- Left Hand/Right Hand: Giving to the Needy: "With God, I can give without seeking reward. Matt 6:1-4

Sunday School 5th and 6th Grade: These kids will continue in their studies of the Feasts and Festivals of the Old Testament, seeing them in historical content and how they point to Jesus, our Messiah and Savior, in the New Testament

- Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur)
- Festival of Tabernacles (Sukkot)
- Purim
- Chanukah, Advent, Christmas and Sabbath

Please keep our church family, pastors, teachers and children lifted up in prayer. As always, we look forward to spending time with your children, learning more about our Great God and the plans and promises He has for all of us.

Wednesday Evening Ministry - 6:30-8:30: H2O Kids - Drop off at the Fellowship Hall

Please sign your children in at the Fellowship Hall. All the children start the evening together with games, a skit and worship. The age groups split up, K-2nd grades/3rd-5th grades for the Lesson, small group discussion and craft.

The children are still learning in the Series, "BUGS", that Little Things Make a Big Difference. Scripture Inspiration Psalm 19:1, "The heavens declare the glory of God and the skies proclaim the work of His hands"

- Roly Poly: 2 Chronicles 20:1-30, Jehosaphat leads Judah to Victory. When Roly Poly gets spooked, he rolls into a little ball and often gets batted around! God doesn't want us to hide in fear, but to trust Him and be brave.
- Praying Mantis: Luke 18:9-14, Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. The praying Mantis only looks like he is praying to God, but He is looking for something to eat! God want us to be a people who genuinely pray and seek Him, everyday!
- Mosquito: Hebrews 12:1-2, Mosquitos are bloodsuckers, but they are minor irritants compared to the "little sins" that hold us back from serving God. We need to let go of sinful habits, so we can focus on Jesus.
- Cricket: Psalm 100, You cannot ignore the crickets: they are loud and they demand to be heard. God wants us to raise our voices and praise the Lord!

Only 2 more BUGS left in this series. Read about them and the new series we will start, in next month's newsletter. As always, please keep our Church Family in your prayers and actively seek a way to serve each other and our neighbors. When we ask the children, who are our neighbors, they answer from the heart and say the whole world! We cannot physically serve the whole world, however we can lift them in prayer, and that is the best way to help anyone.

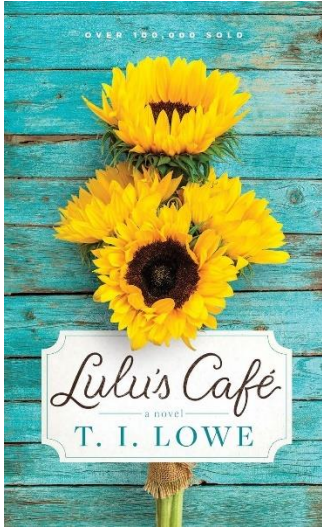
Women's Ministry

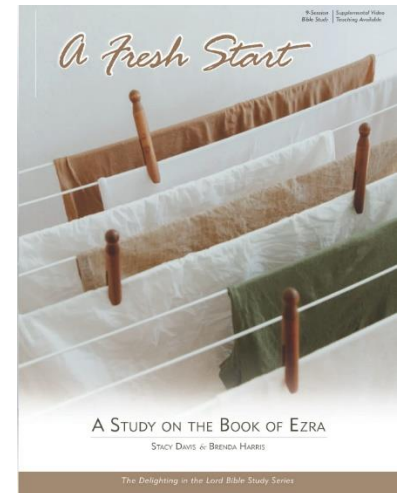
