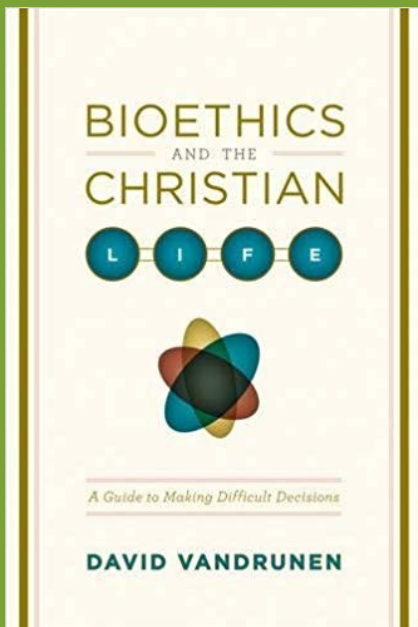

Bioethics And The Christian Life



Just about everyone will face a difficult bioethics decision at some point. In this book a theologian, ethicist, and lawyer equips Christians to make such decisions based on biblical truth, wisdom, and virtue.

Though a relatively new discipline, bioethics has generated extraordinary interest due to a number of socially pressing issues. *Bioethics and the Christian Life* places bioethics within the holistic context of the Christian life, both developing a general Christian approach to making bioethics decisions and addressing a number of specific, controversial areas of bioethics.

Clear, concise, and well-organized, the book is divided into three sections. The first lays the theological foundation for bioethics decision making and discusses the importance of wisdom and virtue in working through these issues. The second section addresses beginning-of-life issues, such as abortion, stem-cell research, and infertility treatments. The third section covers end-of-life issues, such as living wills, accepting and refusing medical treatment, and treatment of patients in permanent vegetative states. July Missions

The Stokes family lives in the mountains of Papua Indonesia amongst a people group named the “Dem.” They are an isolated people group that have no written form of their language, never had any western influences and are completely remote. The only way in or out is by using a small missionary plane or their feet.

They have completed the translation of the Bible into the native language and have taught their first round of over 80 lessons of the Gospel. They have experienced several hundred native Dem coming to listen each day.

Currently the Stokes cannot return to the tribe at this time due to tribal fighting, but are training natives in a neighboring village.

Where they live there is no power company, no water company, no roads or corner mini mart. They live off solar panels, water from a stream and the trip to the

grocery store is a plane landing with a couple months’ worth of food.

“We are Jeremiah & Briana Stokes. We have 3 children Eden Jericho and Noelle and we are missionaries with New Tribes Mission in Indonesia.

We moved overseas July 4, 2010. We are both from Pennsylvania but opposite sides of the state. Briana is from eastern Pa and Jeremiah is from Pittsburgh. We both grew up in Christian homes but when we were in our first year of college, we were confronted with the fact that there are unreached tribal people groups that have no access to the Bible.”

Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

Please continue to pray for a building to meet the increasing needs of the youth and school-aged ministries within the church.

We are planning to add benches near the water fountain out front. A small group generously donated money for that project last year and with the weather warming up, it will be nice to be able to sit next to the waterfall. So be on the lookout for that.

The library renovation is nearing completion, with a new hallway sign officially renaming the space as "Conference room." The newly renovated room was used extensively this past month for Vacation Bible School, with the new layout working perfectly to host nearly 50 kids plus adults. We will still need help

finishing the walls with a second coat of paint, installing trim and baseboard, and adding an accent wall on the north side wall adjacent to the cafe. If you would like to help with this project, please let us know by filling out a yellow card in the sanctuary seats.

Our school (Calvary Christian Academy) is expanding this Fall, and we will be preparing the classrooms downstairs to accommodate the increased enrollment. A family in the church has generously donated funds to divide room 22/23 into two full separate classrooms, with room 22 becoming a science lab.

Our mowing team is doing a great job with maintaining the property. If you are interested in helping with mowing



or other ground maintenance (like pulling weeds, trimming, leaf collection in the fall, etc.), please let us know by filling out a yellow card.

Later this summer we are looking into expanding our bookstore with additional shelving and inventory graciously obtained from another local bookstore that has since gone out of business. The new shelving will expand our inventory and allow us to provide even more resources to help you grow in your faith.

Thank you all for your continued help and support! Please pray for our volunteers who help with the property and please consider serving in this area if you are able!

Spiritual Care:

God's Renewing Order in Our Lives

Genesis 1:1-3 begins with divine power: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." The earth was formless, void, and dark, but the Spirit of God hovered over the waters. When God declared, "Let there be light," light pierced the chaos, initiating order. This scripture, highlighted in a recent Sunday teaching at our church, showcases God's nature to bring life and structure from disorder and chaos.

Let's take a moment to relate it to mental health struggles, like anxiety and depression, which can feel like that formless void. While inviting God's Spirit into our hearts doesn't guarantee the absence of these challenges, His presence renews our minds and reshapes our perspective. God's transformative word offers hope, helping us see our struggles through His lens of purpose and peace, even when difficulties persist.

One practical step to embrace this renewal is daily prayer. Intentional prayer invites God's ordering presence, reminding us of His power to bring light into darkness. Through prayer, we trust God to guide us, renewing our outlook and strength to face mental health challenges with His enduring hope.

- Listening Ears: Goliath spoke in angry words. But David listened to God's word instead. David did what God told him to do. Little ones will say "I will listen to God". 1 John

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: (Downstairs Classroom)

The kids will be finishing the series titled, "Psalms, The Big Book of Big Emotions". They will be starting a new series called Friends.

- Joy: Joy is not an emotion! Psalm 84
The writer of this psalm is filled with joy thinking about dwelling in the house of the Lord. He teaches us that being in the presence of the Lord and putting our hope in God brings joy. Trusting in God during this journey called life, reminds us that when we put our trust in God, we are truly blessed.

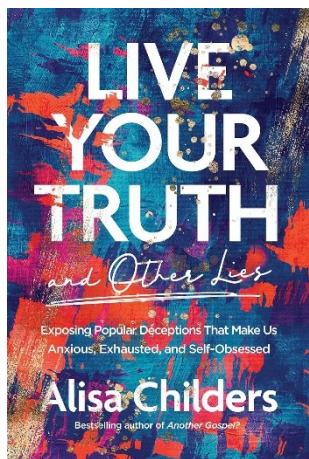
