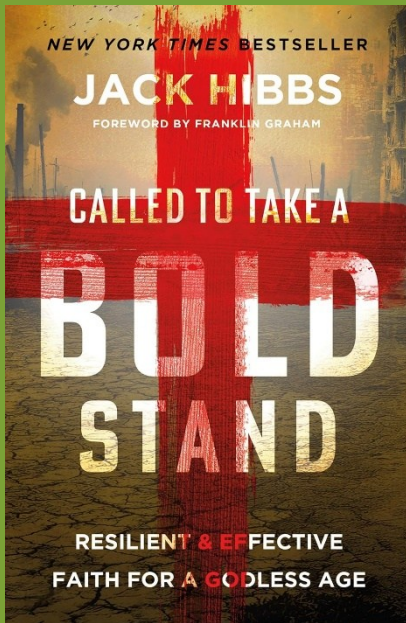

When David and Lee began in ministry it was with Haven of Hope in Philadelphia. Their objective was to be a place where the Gospel is presented boldly, and women imprisoned by drug addictions can have a new life through faith, hope, and strength in Jesus Christ.

Moving on from there David worked at World Evangelization for Christ (WEC) headquarters in Fort Washington, PA. WEC helps local churches strategically focus their mission and ministry. They develop partnerships with missionaries in the field, recruits missionaries, and sends out short-term teams. It was while working here that David and Lee gained a desire to see the people of Morocco reached with the message of Jesus.

Feeling a calling from the Lord to use his gifts and talents to help evangelize and disciple, David is

currently serving as a pastor of a congregation consisting of mostly sub-Saharan African Christians in the country of Morocco. Lee, his wife, is also working with the church in discipleship and women's ministries.

David: "We ask that you pray for us to be able to visit the new attendees of our church; It's hard to fit in all that we have to do. Pray also for the deepening of the spiritual lives of our leaders and that they will resist the huge temptations that are constantly in their face. Pray for the continued progress on the sanctuary enlargement and that we can learn who to go to get the authorization. Please continue to pray for a hunger and thirst for the Word of God by our

church members. At times, it seems like they are mainly interested in miracles, supernatural manifestations and "prosperity" more than the Giver Himself. Lastly, pray that God will draw those who are in the peripheral of the church family into a vibrant relationship with Him."

Fall is upon us, and with that a whole season of things to pray for and get involved with. For starters, the school started its new (and first) year as the Calvary Chapel Academy, providing Christian education for students from 3 years old through 6th grade. So, please keep them in your prayer as they explore subjects like reading, writing, science, history, music, culinary arts, Spanish, Bible, and more! There are also some other things coming this month with the men's ministry, women's ministry, youth, and others. So be sure to read through the announcements and check the bulletin each week.

Our series, "Genesis to Jesus" is continuing as we conclude Noah's Ark and move into the story of Abraham and Isaac. MUSIC MOMENTS "Holy, Holy, Holy"



"'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty,' who was, and is, and is to come.'" –
Revelation 4:8

The hymn "Holy, Holy, Holy" by Reginald Heber is a profound expression of Christian worship that draws directly from the imagery of Revelation, the final book of the Bible. Written in 1826, the hymn echoes Revelation 4:8, where celestial beings around God's throne cry, "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty..." This repetition of "holy" emphasizes the perfect, eternal holiness of God—a central theme in both the hymn and the scripture.

Each stanza of the hymn builds upon the vision of heavenly worship described in Revelation. Angels, saints, and all creation are pictured as joining together in eternal praise of the triune God. The hymn also acknowledges human limitation: though sinful and unworthy, believers are invited to join in heaven's worship through grace.

Musically majestic and lyrically rich, "Holy, Holy, Holy" captures the awe and reverence found in John's apocalyptic vision. It reminds us as Christians that worship is not merely a Sunday act but a reflection of the eternal praise that is already happening in heaven. By singing it, we align our voices with those of the angels, proclaiming the holiness of God across time and eternity.

Spiritual Care: The Transformative Power of Forgiveness

Forgiveness is a divine act that reflects the heart of God, as seen in Matthew 6:14-15: "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins." This scripture reveals the profound power of forgiveness, not only in restoring relationships but also in unlocking spiritual freedom.

Holding onto grudges breeds bitterness, which can spiral into hatred, anger, and depression. These emotions create walls between us and others, hindering God-honoring relationships and distancing us from the fullness of God's grace. Unforgiveness is a chain that binds the soul, keeping us trapped in pain and resentment.

In contrast, forgiveness is a choice to release these burdens. It acknowledges our own imperfections and the mercy we have received from God. By

forgiving, we mirror Christ's love, choosing freedom over captivity. This act not only heals relationships but also aligns us with God's heart, opening the door to His forgiveness and peace. As we let go of resentment, we embrace the liberty and joy of a life unburdened, fully surrendered to God's transformative grace. Who will you choose to forgive today?

11:00 AM Service: Kids are dismissed following the songs of worship to Children's Church and Care Room

Preschool - Kindergarten Sunday School: Fruit of the Spirit (Meets upstairs in Pre-K Classroom)

*Parents, please see the take home papers your children bring home after class. They will better help you know how to reinforce what they have learned, as well as help you help them with the memory verse. Your children will continue in the series, Fruit of the Spirit.

- Joy: Romans 15:13 Happiness is an emotion. Joy is something greater. We can have joy even when we are sad, because we know Jesus.
- Peace: Matthew 5:9, God wants us to be peacemakers. He wants us to get along with others as best as we can.
- Patience: Isaiah 40:31, Patience is not easy for anyone. God can help us be patient and teach us to trust Him.
- Kindness: Ephesians 4:32, Jesus was kind to everyone He met. He wants us to be kind to others so they can see His kindness in us.

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: (Downstairs Classroom)

*Parents, please see the "Make it Stick" papers we send home with the children, for a better description and how to reinforce what they are learning throughout the week. We also send home a memory verse for them to learn. We give them incentive to remember scripture, lollipops!

The kids will be continuing to learn more about the Fruits of the Spirit. The series is titled "Farmer's Market

Memory Verse: "But the Fruit of the Spirit produces is love, joy and peace. It is being patient, kind and good. It is being faithful, gentle and having control of oneself. There is no law against things of that kind.

- Joy: Matthew 5:1-12, When life gets hard, it's tough to stay positive. But no matter what our circumstances, we can have joy. Nothing can take away Jesus, and Jesus can give us joy now and forever!
- Peace: Mark 4:35-41, When life gets hard, it can be full of storms. If we call on Jesus, we can have peace, His peace, even in the hardest times.
- Patience: Matthew 4:1-11, It's not easy waiting for what we want, but when we give in to impatience, we often regret it. We need to wait on God's best and God's timing. We need to be patient and wait on the Lord.
- Kindness: Luke 19:1-10, When people are mean to us, it is tempting to be mean back. Jesus wants us to treat everyone with kindness. When we are kind to people, that kindness can spread to others.

Sunday School 5th and 6th Grade: (Downstairs Classroom)

The kids will be finishing 2 Peter. The kids will study Heaven and Earth, Hell and Judgement, according to what the Bible says. Reflecting on a good, loving, gracious Heavenly Father and His mercy.

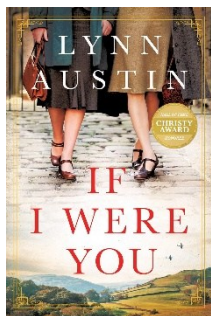
