Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

The winter has arrived and the cold is here. We have a few things to share about the property ministry here at the church.

We are looking to improve our church fellowship ministry by installing a new and updated mailbox system for those attending the fellowship. The current “church mailboxes” are located in the Children’s ministry wing and often behind locked doors on a Sunday morning (these will be removed). The new mailboxes will be bigger and installed behind the Acts 2:42 Verse wall in the Lobby Coat Room near the restrooms (by Calvary Café). These will be much closer to the sanctuary and be more easily accessible.

As the cold season moves in, we do ask that you bear with us as our heating system works hard to keep the

building comfortable. We realize that certain rooms may be slightly cooler than others and may require a sweater or jacket. Being proactive in these measures can help us keep heating costs down during the cold winter months.

As a reminder from last year, the elder board has made the decision to improve building security throughout the week and during services. Our plan is to implement these security measures as discretely as possible, as to not disrupt the normal flow of worship. These security improvements include keeping the office and classroom areas locked during business hours throughout the week (as posted on our main entrance), keeping the hallway doors locked during Sunday morning children’s ministries, and locking the rear lower-level doors at the back parking lot. More



improvements to follow this year.

Please continue to pray for a building to meet the increasing needs of the youth and school-aged ministries within the church.

We will be looking to finalize and schedule our grass mowing and lawn-care team for the Spring and Summer seasons. If you are interested in serving in this area, please let us know either on a yellow contact card, at the Event Sign-Up kiosk, or by contacting the church office throughout the week.

MUSIC MOMENTS

"Better is One Day"

"For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere." – Psalm 84:10

Psalm 84 paints a picture of deep longing for God's presence. The psalmist does not see faith as a distant obligation, but as a desire rooted in love: to be near God is to be truly alive. God's dwelling place is described as beautiful, safe, and joy-filled—a home for the soul. This psalm reminds us that life with God is not about location or ritual alone, but about a heart that continually turns toward Him.

The contemporary worship song "Better Is One Day" echoes this same truth. Drawing inspiration from Psalm 84, the song emphasizes that even a single day lived in God's presence is worth more than a lifetime spent chasing comfort, success, or recognition apart from Him. It reframes our priorities, reminding us that God Himself is the greatest reward of faith.

As we enter 2026, I challenge us all to examine how we live. Do we treat time with God as optional, or as essential? Striving to live for God means seeking His presence daily—through prayer, worship, obedience, and trust. It means finding our strength and joy not in circumstances, but in who God is.

Living in God's presence does not remove hardship, but it gives purpose and hope within it. When we desire God above all else, our lives are shaped by His love. Like the psalmist, we learn that true blessing is not found in what we have, but in whom we dwell with—because life with God is always better.

Hello H2O Church Family, Pastor Jason here, and I'm thrilled to share that I have stepped into the role of Youth Pastor here at Shepherd of the Hills Calvary Chapel.

Some of you already know me, as I've had the privilege of serving as a pastor on staff for the past four years. During that time, I've overseen our Care Ministries, facilitated onboarding classes, and provided biblical counseling. What you may not know is that I've spent over 10 years working with kids and teens in biblical counseling settings. Even during my own teenage and young adult years, I was deeply involved in youth ministry as a leader—teaching teen Bible studies, organizing events, and discipling youth.

New Year New Hope

There are those of us who may struggle with the idea of a new year. Not knowing what the future holds can be one source of anxiousness in our lives. The nation of Israel struggled with not knowing how God was going to work in their enslavement to Babylon. They were only asked to trust in their God who has always made a way for them.

Isaiah 43:19: "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

The Israelites must have wrestled with fear, anger & regret thinking that their God had abandoned them. Through his prophet Isaiah, the Lord is reminding them that in times past, he has provided a way for his people. These words echoed in their souls as they remembered that God had indeed split the seas and led their ancestors through the wilderness. He is now preparing them for something new.

How do you feel today as we are in a new year? Take some time to openly share this with the Lord through prayer. Praise him for the feelings of joyful expectations. Humbly go before him with open honesty about the fears and anxiousness you may have. Allow him to remind you just how much he has watched over you in the past and will continue to do so in this new year.

CALVARY KIDS ministry

Calvary Kids is the children's ministries of Shepherd of the Hills Calvary Chapel, it includes everything kid: Sunday school, children's church, our care room and the infant's crib room are all included. In addition, our summer Vacation Bible School, our Wednesday night H2O Kids, and other children's events are all part of Calvary Kids.

Sunday Morning Kids Ministries:

9:30 AM Service: Kids are encouraged to attend our Sunday School for all ages for the whole 9:30-10:30 AM hour. We also have childcare for infants and toddlers.

11:00 AM Service: Kids are dismissed following the songs of worship to Children's Church and Care Room

*****Children are encouraged to bring in their water bottles and Bibles*****

Preschool - Kindergarten Sunday School: Fruit of the Spirit (Meets upstairs in Pre-K Classroom)

*Parents, please see the take home paper your children bring home after class. These papers will show you what they have learned in Sunday School. Your children will be finishing the last lesson in the series, JOSEPH and starting a new series "TALKING WITH GOD". Theme: When we pray, we are talking to God, just like we talk to mommy and daddy. We can thank God for things he's given us, ask Him for help and talk to Him when we are scared. Memory Verse: "Never Stop Praying" 1 Thessalonians 5:17

- Joseph: Genesis 45:1-15, "Peaceful Reunion" I can trust God, He always has a plan for me.
- Thank God: Luke 17:11-19, "Jesus Heals Ten Men". Children learn to thank God for all the good things He has done for them.
- Ask For Help: Daniel 6:10-23, "Daniel in the Lion Den". Little ones will learn they can ask God for help in **EVERY** situation.
- Talk to Him When You are Afraid: Jonah 1:17-2:2. The children will learn that they can talk to God **WHENEVER** they are afraid-He loves them and will help them to not be afraid anymore.

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: (Downstairs Classroom)

*Parents, please see the "Make it Stick" papers we send home with the children, for a better description and how to reinforce what they have learned throughout the week. We also send home a memory verse for them to learn. We give them incentive to remember scripture, lollipops!

The children have started a new series the last Sunday of November titled: "Acts, a Study of the Early Church". They will finish this lesson series by the end of January. Memory Verse: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you. Then you will tell people about me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria. Acts 1:8

- Peter's Wildest Dream: Acts 10:9-19, 34-36, Peter has a vision that the church is for everyone.
- Stephen's Stand: Acts 7:54-60, The children will learn the church is to strengthen us to face persecution.
- On a Mission: Acts 13:15,49-52, The church is a place to send out missionaries to spread the Good News, that includes them.
- Tag Team Teaching: Acts 18:1-2,18-26, Priscilla and Aquila teach Apollos that the church is a place where everyone has a role to play

Sunday School 5th and 6th Grade: (Downstairs Classroom)

The children are studying the book of Revelation, God's redemptive plan for His people, creation, and the Revelation of Christ Jesus our conquering King. Looking also into the OT Books of Daniel, Ezekiel and Isaiah, which point to the hope of the faithful, by God's divine intervention in history. A reassurance for the Lord's church, that God reigns. Jesus has already won the victory, God's Kingdom prevails!

Wednesday Evenings - CALVARY KIDS CLUB - 6:30-8:30: H2O Kids - Drop off at the Fellowship Hall

Please bring your children and sign them in on sign-in sheet on the table, outside the Fellowship Hall. *If the weather is nice, they can then come to the playground. At 8:30 we will bring the children upstairs to be picked up outside the Fellowship Hall. Children will be learning through Bible stories, object lessons, games and crafts, all reinforcing God's Word. They will also have a time of worship.

Youth Club will resume with its normal schedule on Wednesday January 14th. We will review the Books of the Bible Series and finish the first Wed in February.

****Memory Verse:** Every word of God is flawless; He is a shield to those who take refuge in Him. Proverbs 30:5

- Church History: Acts 2:42-47, "The Early Church", This book reminds us the "acts" of love and unselfishness are how we share Christ's love with the world.
- Letters to Churches: Galatians 5:22-25, "The Fruit of the Spirit", These 9 "fruits give us a great guideline to check our lives to see if we are living like Christ.
- Letters to Friends: Hebrews 11:1-9, 11:32-34,12:1-3, The next 12 books of the New Testament are also letters. Some were written by Paul and others were written by other early leaders in the church like James and Jude, the half-brothers of Jesus, Peter and John. These above mentioned passages remind us that all through history, people have believed in God even when life was hard because of the great promise of eternal life.
- The Last Book: Revelation 22:1-13, Jesus is Coming Soon, The book of Revelation reminds us that everything God promises will come true. Even when things get very difficult on earth, before Jesus comes again, we can live without fear and have joy when life is hard, with Jesus as our Savior, King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Have your children bring a friend or neighbor to Youth club, so they too can hear about Jesus and have fun while learning. Please pray for the teachers, helpers and the children, asking that we all be led and taught by the Holy Spirit, as we explore God's amazing Word this new year, 2026.


