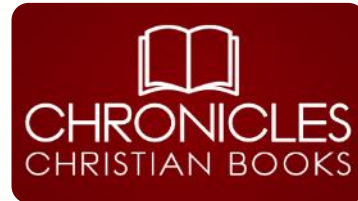

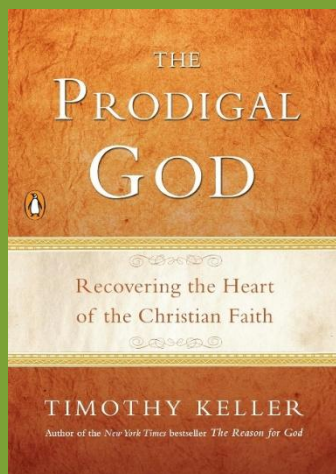

February Missions

When David and Lee began in ministry it was with Haven of Hope in Philadelphia. Their objective was to be a place where the Gospel is presented boldly, and women imprisoned by drug addictions can have a new life through faith, hope, and strength in Jesus Christ.

Moving on from there David worked at World Evangelization for Christ (WEC) headquarters in Fort Washington, PA. WEC helps local churches strategically focus their mission and ministry. They develop partnerships with missionaries in the field, recruits missionaries, and sends out short-term teams. It was while working here that David and Lee gained a desire to see the people of Morocco reached with the message of Jesus.

Feeling a calling from the Lord to use his gifts and talents to help evangelize and disciple, David is

currently serving as a pastor of a congregation consisting of mostly sub-Saharan African Christians in the country of Morocco. Lee, his wife, is also working with the church in discipleship and women's ministries.

David: "We ask that you pray for us to be able to visit the new attendees of our church; It's hard to fit in all that we have to do. Pray also for the deepening of the spiritual lives of our leaders and that they will resist the huge temptations that are constantly in their face. Pray for the continued progress on the sanctuary enlargement and that we can learn who to go to get the authorization. Please continue to pray for a hunger and thirst for the Word of God by our

church members. At times, it seems like they are mainly interested in miracles, supernatural manifestations and "prosperity" more than the Giver Himself. Lastly, pray that God will draw those who are in the peripheral of the church family into a vibrant relationship with Him."

Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

The winter has arrived and the cold is here. We have a few things to share about the property ministry here at the church.

We are looking to improve our church fellowship ministry by installing a new and updated mailbox system for those attending the fellowship. The current church mailboxes are located in the Children's ministry wing and often behind locked doors on a Sunday morning (these will be removed). The new mailboxes will be bigger and installed behind the Acts 2:42 Verse wall in the Lobby Coat Room near the restrooms (by Calvary Café). These will be much closer to the sanctuary and more easily accessible.

As the cold season moves in, we do ask that you bear with us as our heating system works hard to keep the

building comfortable. We realize that certain rooms may be slightly cooler than others and may require a sweater or jacket. Being proactive in these measures can help us keep heating costs down during the cold winter months.

As a reminder from last year, the elder board has made the decision to improve building security throughout the week and during services. Our plan is to implement these security measures as discretely as possible, as to not disrupt the normal flow of worship. These security improvements include keeping the office and classroom areas locked during business hours throughout the week (as posted on our main entrance), keeping the hallway doors locked during Sunday morning children's ministries, and locking the rear lower-level doors at the back parking lot. More



improvements to follow this year.

Please continue to pray for a building to meet the increasing needs of the youth and school-aged ministries within the church.

We will be looking to finalize and schedule our grass mowing and lawn-care team for the Spring and Summer seasons. If you are interested in serving in this area, please let us know either on a yellow contact card, at the Event Sign-Up kiosk, or by contacting the church office throughout the week.

HIS TO OWN YOUTH UPDATES

“Serving With Sweet Purpose”

The H2O Jr. and Sr. High students turned one Wednesday night into a powerful act of service and mission. Instead of their usual midweek routine, the youth gathered around tables covered in chocolate, and cooling racks, working together to create handmade candy. Every student had a role, dipping, cooling, sorting, and finally boxing each set of treats with care and purpose.

These candy boxes are not just a fundraiser. They are a launching pad for this summer's youth missions trip, where our students will partner with another church to help run a Vacation Bible School.

Many of these children come from neighborhoods where hope feels distant and the name of Jesus is rarely spoken. VBS becomes a place where they can laugh, feel safe, and hear the gospel clearly and lovingly.

That vision is what fueled our teens as they worked. Between jokes and sticky fingers, they talked about the kids they hope to meet and the stories of Jesus they are eager to share. Their one Wednesday night became something far bigger, a joyful sacrifice of time and energy so that young hearts, miles away, might encounter the love of Christ.

We are proud of their dedication and excited to see how God uses their obedience this summer.

MUSIC MOMENTS “Better is One Day”

“For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.” – Psalm 84:10

Psalm 84 paints a picture of deep longing for God’s presence. The psalmist does not see faith as a distant obligation, but as a desire rooted in love: to be near God is to be truly alive. God’s dwelling place is described as beautiful, safe, and joy-filled—a home for the soul. This psalm reminds us that life with God is not about location or ritual alone, but about a heart that continually turns toward Him.

The contemporary worship song “Better Is One Day” echoes this same truth. Drawing inspiration from Psalm 84, the song emphasizes that even a single day lived in God’s presence is worth more than a lifetime spent chasing comfort, success, or recognition apart from Him. It reframes our priorities, reminding us that God Himself is the greatest reward of faith.

As we enter 2026, I challenge us all to examine how we live. Do we treat time with God as optional, or as essential? Striving to live for God means seeking His presence daily—through prayer, worship, obedience, and trust. It means finding our strength and joy not in circumstances, but in who God is.

Living in God’s presence does not remove hardship, but it gives purpose and hope within it. When we desire God above all else, our lives are shaped by His love. Like the psalmist, we learn that true blessing is not found in what we have, but in whom we dwell with—because life with God is always better.

Spiritual Care:

Finding Steadfast Hope in a Shifting World

Ecclesiastes speaks with a raw honesty that resonates deeply with anyone facing mental health challenges. The writer, traditionally understood as Solomon, does not hide his confusion, weariness, or emotional heaviness.

He names the very feelings many people today struggle to articulate: emptiness, frustration, anxiety about the future, and the sense that life’s efforts sometimes feel pointless. Instead of avoiding these realities, Ecclesiastes brings them into the light, showing that God is not intimidated by human struggle

For someone wrestling with discouragement or emotional fatigue, this book becomes a surprising companion. It validates the experience of feeling overwhelmed while gently redirecting the heart toward what is solid and lasting. Ecclesiastes repeatedly reminds us that life “under the sun” cannot carry the weight of our hope. Achievements, possessions, pleasure, and even wisdom have limits. But the book does not end in despair. It points upward.

In its closing chapters, Ecclesiastes anchors the reader in a simple but profound truth: meaning and stability are found in fearing God and trusting His care. When mental health feels fragile, this perspective offers comfort. God sees the burdens we carry, invites us to rest in Him, and provides a foundation stronger than shifting emotions. In this way, Ecclesiastes becomes not a book of gloom but a pathway to deeper trust, honest faith, and enduring peace in the Lord

Preschool - Kindergarten Sunday School: Fruit of the Spirit (Meets upstairs in Pre-K Classroom)

*Parents, please see the take home paper your children bring home after class. These papers will show you what they have learned in Sunday School. Your children started a new series "TALKING WITH GOD". Theme: When we pray, we are talking to God, just like we talk to mommy and daddy. We can thank God for things he's given us, ask Him for help and talk to Him when we are scared. Memory Verse: "Never Stop Praying" 1 Thessalonians 5:17

- Joseph: Genesis 45:1-15, "Peaceful Reunion" I can trust God, He always has a plan for me.
- Thank God: Luke 17:11-19, "Jesus Heals Ten Men". Children learn to thank God for all the good things He has done for them.
- Ask For Help: Daniel 6:10-23, "Daniel in the Lion Den". Little ones will learn they can ask God for help in EVERY situation.
- Talk to Him When You are Afraid: Jonah 1:17-2:2. The children will learn that they can talk to God WHENEVER they are afraid-He loves them and will help them to not be afraid anymore.

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: (Downstairs Classroom)

*Parents, please see the "Make it Stick" papers we send home with the children, for a better description and how to reinforce what they have learned throughout the week. We also send home a memory verse for them to learn. We give them incentive to remember scripture, lollipops!

Due to the weather, the children did not finish this lesson series, ACTS, A study of the Early Church, by the end of January. We will continue in this series and start a new series, Creation Museum. Memory Verse for Acts: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you. Then you will tell people about me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria. Acts 1:8

Memory Verse for Genesis Museum: "He who sits on the throne said, 'I am making all things new! Then he said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.'" Rev. 21:5

- On a Mission: Acts 13:15,49-52, The church is a place to send out missionaries to spread the Good News, that includes them.
- Tag Team Teaching: Acts 18:1-2,18-26, Priscilla and Aquila teach Apollos that the church is a place where everyone has a role to play.
- The Foundation: Genesis 1, The Beginning: Museums do not appear out of nowhere, they start with a good foundation. A foundation where a group of people who want to share something with the world. Our world began with the strongest foundation, our Creator God, who made us.
- The Gallery: Genesis 2, The Garden: The gallery is where we see the amazing things in a museum. God made a beautiful creation and invited man and woman (and us) to enjoy all He created.

Sunday School 5th and 6th Grade: (Downstairs Classroom)

The children will be studying 1st & 2nd Thessalonians: Leveling Up, discovering how our faith helps us stand strong through trials and why growing in faith is important to our lives.

Wednesday Evenings - CALVARY KIDS CLUB - 6:30-8:30: H2O Kids - Drop off at the Fellowship Hall

In February the children will review the Books of the Bible and finish the first Wed with the last book in God's Word, Revelation. They will then start new series titled, Kid's Travel Guide to the Beatitudes. Jesus left no doubt that being a Christian can be challenging. The children will go on a journey to discover a wealth of wisdom about how to live a life full of blessings, even when things get tough. They will learn about all the wonderful ways that God shows his love in their lives, no matter the circumstances.

The Last Book: Revelation 22:1-13, Jesus is Coming Soon, the book of Revelation reminds us that everything God promises will come true. Even when things get very difficult on earth, before Jesus comes again, we can live without fear and have joy when life is hard, with Jesus as our Savior, King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

- Journey 1. Jesus calls His Disciples: Matthew 4:18-22, Jesus wants to be our friend and Savior
- Journey 2. The Crowds Follow Jesus: Matthew 4:23-25, We want to follow Jesus.
- Journey 3. The Sermon on the Mount: Matthew 5:1-2, Following the teachings of Jesus changes our hearts for good.

Ask your children bring a friend or neighbor to H2O Youth Club, so they too can hear about Jesus and have fun while learning. Please pray for the teachers, helpers and the children, asking that we all be led and taught by the Holy Spirit, as we explore what God has instored for each one. Children are so open to the love that Jesus has for them. "But Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven.'"
