



March Missions

After his conversion to Christianity in 1971 Bob became affiliated with Jews for Jesus in 1979. He is the leader of Jews for Jesus Austral/Asia, a territory which now includes Singapore and New Zealand as well. He lives in Sydney with his wife.

Bob travels throughout the world sharing the message of Messiah Y'shua. He has preached or ministered on the streets in Korea, New Zealand, Singapore, Argentina, visited 47 of the 50 states in the US, all over the traps in Australia from Perth to Townsville to Melbourne to Port Macquarie. Not only is Bob's style winsome, but his message of faith in Jesus is powerful.

Bob is also the creator and director of Project Timothy, an international messianic internship and discipleship program for young adults from 18-25.

Bob Mendelsohn is our **Missions Commitment** focus for the month of March. Bob currently serves in Sydney, Australia with Jews for Jesus.

"I had always been proud to be Jewish. There was some mystique to all these dos and don'ts that were supposed to improve me as a person and, in particular, as a Jew. I was fervent, not so much about God, but about "doing" Judaism correctly. It was my job, as a Jew, to observe these commands and comply. I figured that even if there were no God, it couldn't hurt to comply. Yet hard as I tried, I always seemed to fall short; there was always something more to do, or not do.

In my early twenties I found myself in a conversation with a pair of street corner preachers. Their education was limited but their faith was genuine. The person of Jesus was very appealing.

The New Testament was a defensible book; the gospel was a defensible story. As I found myself drawn to Jesus I began asking myself, how could I do this? How could I be Jewish and believe in Jesus? It seemed like such a paradox."

An Update from the Pastor...



Hi church! I wanted to start by saying thank you to everyone for all your encouragement and support of the ministry here at Shepherd. Also, thanks to everyone who came out to our chili cook-off and vision meeting last month – it was a great time, and congratulations to the chili winners! At the meeting we discussed some things that I wanted to just remind everyone about some of the highlights:

Operation Christmas Child: last year went better than expected and we hope to keep the momentum going in 2026. So, start gathering items to fill boxes now because before we know it, Fall will be here.

We also discussed various property updates, the plans for VBS, counseling, small groups, Youth ministries, men's and women's ministries, and other areas of the church.

Another area to mention is the school. Our school was reorganized this year into what is now Calvary Chapel Academy and, I am happy to say, it is doing exceedingly well. In fact, we have come to the point of needing a full-time director, which we have hired. On 3/1, Ashley Mitchom (one of our current teachers) will take over as the academy director. Please welcome her to the team.

Additionally, we discussed the annual budget and gave time for

questions. I am happy to say that the church's finances are strong, and we continue to be blessed through your ongoing support. It is clear you see and believe in what the Lord is doing here at Shepherd!

One other thing mentioned was the need for additional gym space for the youth. We asked that everyone be in prayer for a gym building to be constructed at the current basketball court. This will provide space for the increased number of youth, in addition to a greater variety of activities available to the church. So, please, pray the Lord would provide for the need.

I want to thank everyone again for everything you all do. It is a pleasure to serve you and I look forward to another great year here at Shepherd!

Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

With the winter season on its way out and spring just around the corner, we have a few things to share about the property ministry here at the church.

First, we will be finalizing and scheduling our grass mowing and lawn-care team for the Spring and Summer seasons. If you are interested in serving in this area, please let us know either on a yellow contact card, at the Event Sign-Up kiosk, or by contacting the church office throughout the week.

We are also looking to improve our church fellowship ministry by installing a new and updated mailbox system for those attending the fellowship. The current church mailboxes are located in the Children's ministry wing and often behind locked doors on a Sunday morning (these will

be removed). The new mailboxes will be bigger and installed behind the Acts 2:42 Verse wall in the Lobby Coat Room near the restrooms (by Calvary Café). These will be much closer to the sanctuary and more easily accessible.

We are planning to sell some unused equipment from the shed and barn in order to purchase another mower for the church. More details will follow in the coming weeks.

We will be installing new heating and air conditioning units in several classrooms on the lower level. This will improve comfort level and heating efficiency in these rooms that are used year-round.

Please continue to pray for a building to meet the increasing needs of the youth and school-aged ministries within the church.



We will be planning a Spring-cleaning day in the future. Please consider coming out to help get the church ready for warmer weather.

HIS TO OWN YOUTH UPDATES

“What Our Teens Are Learning Through Ecclesiastes”

In The H2O Youth, our journey through Ecclesiastes has opened honest conversations about life, purpose, and the God who meets us in every season. Each week, we’ve walked with Solomon as he wrestles with questions teens quietly carry: *Why does life feel repetitive? Why don’t success or pleasure satisfy? What do I do with the hard things I can’t fix?*

What has encouraged us most is how our teens have responded. Several students have shared how refreshing it is that Scripture doesn’t avoid difficult seasons of life.

Instead of pretending everything is fine, Ecclesiastes names the frustration, confusion, and emptiness we all feel at times. Teens are learning that God is not only present in the good moments—He is sufficient in the hard ones.

Instead of rushing past the hard questions of life, our teens have been discovering that Ecclesiastes invites them to slow down and wrestle honestly with what matters. They’ve talked about how the book exposes the emptiness of trying to build an identity on things that don’t last, and how God uses both joy and struggle to shape a grounded, resilient faith. Many have shared that it’s freeing to realize they don’t have to pretend everything is perfect—God meets them in confusion, disappointment, and uncertainty.

As we continue studying Ecclesiastes in the weeks ahead, we invite our church family to pray for our teenagers—that the Lord would prepare their hearts to hear what He has next and to grow in wisdom that lasts beyond their youth.

MUSIC MOMENTS

“Better is One Day”

“For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.” – Psalm 84:10

Psalm 84 paints a picture of deep longing for God’s presence. The psalmist does not see faith as a distant obligation, but as a desire rooted in love: to be near God is to be truly alive. God’s dwelling place is described as beautiful, safe, and joy-filled—a home for the soul. This psalm reminds us that life with God is not about location or ritual alone, but about a heart that continually turns toward Him.

The contemporary worship song “Better Is One Day” echoes this same truth. Drawing inspiration from Psalm 84, the song emphasizes that even a single day lived in God’s presence is worth more than a lifetime spent chasing comfort, success, or recognition apart from Him. It reframes our priorities, reminding us that God Himself is the greatest reward of faith.

As we enter 2026, I challenge us all to examine how we live. Do we treat time with God as optional, or as essential? Striving to live for God means seeking His presence daily—through prayer, worship, obedience, and trust. It means finding our strength and joy not in circumstances, but in who God is.

Living in God’s presence does not remove hardship, but it gives purpose and hope within it. When we desire God above all else, our lives are shaped by His love. Like the psalmist, we learn that true blessing is not found in what we have, but in whom we dwell with—because life with God is always better.

Spiritual Care:

Meeting Us at the Well: Hope for Quiet Battles

Some of the hardest battles people face are the ones no one else can see. They’re the quiet struggles carried behind polite smiles — the shame we avoid mentioning, the regrets that replay in the background of our minds, the loneliness that settles in even when we’re surrounded by others. Scripture gives us a powerful picture of this hidden pain in the story of the woman at the well in John 4.

Jesus meets her in the middle of her ordinary day; at a place she likely visited to avoid others. She wasn’t seeking Him, yet He sought her. He didn’t wait for her to clean up her past or prove her worth. Instead, He approached her with dignity, honesty, and compassion. He named her pain without shaming her, and He offered her something she didn’t even know she could receive — “living water,” the grace that reaches the deepest, most unspoken places of the heart.

Her story reminds us that Jesus meets us the same way. He steps into our quiet battles not to condemn but to restore. He sees the parts of us we hide,

and still He offers life, hope, and renewal.

Take ten quiet minutes this week to write down the specific regret or shame you tend to carry alone. Then place your hand over the page and pray, “Lord, meet me here the way You met her. Speak truth where I’ve believed lies, and pour Your living water into this place.” Afterward, cross out the regret and write a promise from Scripture that speaks a better word over your story.

Preschool - Kindergarten Sunday School: Fruit of the Spirit (Meets upstairs in Pre-K Classroom)

Your children will be finishing the series "Ruth" and starting a new series, "Glow" Boaz Marries Ruth: Ruth Chapter 4: Boaz and Ruth get married and God blesses them and they have a son named Obed. Children will say, God is always with me and will bless me. Memory Verse for Glow: "Let your light shine in front of others" Matthew 5:16a

- The Light of the World: John 1:1-15, 8:12-19, Children will learn that just like a dark room is less scary with a night light, our lives are better because we have Jesus.
- Shine Your Light: Following Jesus is like holding a flashlight and to help our friends see. Kids will say, "Jesus helps me to be Salt and Light and He helps me to show others the way to go. Matthew 5:13-16,
- Living Water: John 4:1-14, Like when you are really thirsty and take a drink of water, Jesus gives us joy that makes us feel better no matter what. Kids will say "Jesus gives me joy".
- Burning Bright: Acts 2:1-12, At Pentecost Jesus gives us the Holy Spirit. He makes us brave to go out and share Jesus, like when a bowling pin knocks down another pin, and that pin knocks down another-that is how everyone can know Jesus! Kids will say I GET to share Jesus with others!

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: (Downstairs Classroom)

The children will finish Genesis Museum, and start a series on the Minor Prophets: Memory Verse for Genesis Museum: "He who sits on the throne said, 'I am making all things new!', Then he said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.'" Rev. 21:5

The Challenge: Genesis 3 The Fall, The purpose of many museums is to challenge us to fix what is wrong with the world. God took it on Himself to fix what we broke by sending Jesus. Kids will state why we need Jesus to save us.

The Gift Shop: Acts 2:22-41, Peter addresses the Crowd. Many museums give you the chance to take home a souvenir. God wants to give us the FREE GIFT of salvation so we can come home to Him. Kids will learn how they can be saved.

Memory Verse for "Minor Profits": 1-4, After that, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your old men will have dreams. Your young men will have visions." Joel 2:28

Minor Profits: Minor Profits uses a mining theme to help the kids explore the Minor Prophets, who wrote during a time of great upheaval and turmoil in Israel. Over the next 12 weeks the children will dig a little deeper and embrace the prospect of finding some real diamonds in the rough. lead to Great Treasure

Sunday School 5th and 6th Grade: (Downstairs Classroom)

The children will be studying 1st & 2nd Thessalonians: Leveling Up, discovering how our faith helps us stand strong through trials and why growing in faith is important to our lives.

Wednesday Evenings - CALVARY KIDS CLUB - 6:30-8:30: H2O Kids - Drop off at the Fellowship Hall

Please bring your children and sign them in on the sign-in sheet, located on the table, outside the Fellowship Hall. At 8:30 we will bring the children back upstairs to be picked up outside the Fellowship Hall. Children will be learning through Bible stories, object lessons, games, videos and crafts, all reinforcing God's Word. They will also have a time of worship, and begin and end with prayer. *Please have the children bring their own water bottles and Bibles




