

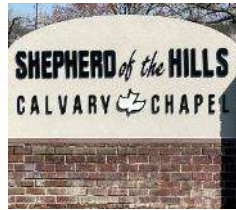
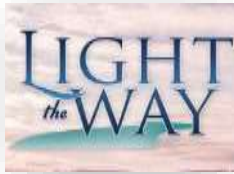

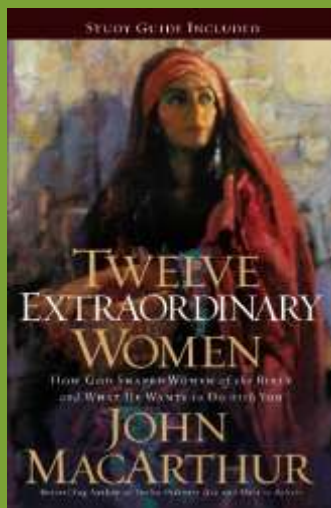

Hi church! It's great to see warmer weather coming and I am looking forward to summer. I want to start by thanking everyone for your prayers and support, the church would not be what it is without your help and encouragement.

I also wanted to let everyone know that we have some things coming this summer you are not going to want to miss. With warmer weather come baptisms. So, if you have not already been baptized, consider making that declaration of faith this year. We are hoping to offer a baptism service about once per month throughout the warm weather. Also, in May our pastors and other leaders will be attending the Calvary Chapel East Coast Pastor's Conference. So, please pray they would be nourished and refreshed.

We are planning some updates to the main lobby and sanctuary to help improve some of the challenges we face such as low lighting, congestion of traffic, and access to areas needed by certain ministries. There is more about that in the property update. If you would like to help with any of these things, please let the office know.

We recently added some rocking chairs to the prayer chapel. Those are intended to provide a quiet, out of the way place for people with small children. The idea is that these are in an area that is still

close to the rest of their family but also that provides for some privacy for nursing moms, and those trying to calm a small child.

We have also been blessed by your support for the school's books and I am happy to say next year's needs are met! Thank you to all who helped with that, it means a lot to know you support the kids so much.

Our teaching series right now is called "Good Grief," and focuses on the issues of life that, at first glance, seem to be difficult and discouraging, but that with the right perspective, we can see God using these things for the ultimate good. I want to encourage you to come out these Sundays, to look for the positive in negative situations, and to be reminded that God is in control!

Property Updates

The church property is large – between 15 and 20 acres. That means it takes constant upkeep and work to ensure it remains capable of meeting the needs of the ministry. Here are some recent updates regarding the property:

Thank you to everyone who came out in April for our spring-cleaning day. We had over 25 volunteers help with mulching, weeding, trimming and removing trees & bushes, and cleaning the church building.

We recently added some rocking chairs and privacy curtains to the prayer chapel. Those are intended to provide a quiet, out of the way place for people with small children.

As everyone can tell, the sanctuary can be quite dark at times, and many have commented on that over the years. We would like to brighten up the room a little but adding lighting becomes costly and unattractive to look at. So, instead, we are planning to brighten the back wall to reflect the natural light coming in from the windows and stained glass, and from the light

fixtures, along with providing a lighter and uplifting atmosphere for worship.

Our Café has been a great addition to the main lobby area, as has been the welcome desk and kiosks. The issue is, however, that they are each located in the space the other should be based on traffic flow and usage. So, because of that, and since neither has enough physical space where they are, we are planning to swap these two locations. This will give each area more usable room, make it easier on parents with



kids, and make it more convenient for people to take their snack to the parlor. It will also open up new areas of service since the café will be able to accommodate more service opportunities and the welcome desk will be able to offer more ways to help people. Look for this sometime this summer.

HIS TO OWN YOUTH UPDATES

“Growing Wise: A Season in Proverbs for H2O Youth”

For the next several months, H2O Youth will be shifting our focus to an in-depth study of the book of Proverbs—a book overflowing with practical wisdom for everyday life. As our teens walk through these chapters, they’ll be learning what it means to pursue godly wisdom in a world that constantly pulls them toward shortcuts, pressure, and distraction. Proverbs speaks directly to the choices they face: friendships, integrity, temptation, emotions, and the daily decisions that shape their character.

Throughout this study, our students will see that wisdom isn’t just information—it’s a way of life rooted in trusting the Lord. They’ll discover how Proverbs connects to their real struggles: navigating peer influence, handling conflict, guarding their hearts, and learning to honor God in both their successes and their challenges. Our prayer is that this series helps them see that God’s wisdom is not outdated or distant, but deeply relevant to the world they’re growing up in.

As we begin this journey, we invite the whole church to join us in prayer. Ask the Lord to prepare the hearts of our teens, to give them teachable spirits, and to grow in them a desire to walk in the fear of the Lord—the beginning of true wisdom.

MUSIC MOMENTS

“I Sing the Mighty Power”

As the freshness of spring unfolds, the hymn “I Sing the Mighty Power of God” offers a timely reminder of God’s provision and care. The song beautifully celebrates the Creator who formed the mountains, spread the flowing seas, and set the stars in motion. In every line, it points us back to the truth that the same God who sustains the universe is also attentive to our daily needs.

Spring is a season of renewal. Flowers bloom, trees bud, and the earth seems to awaken with new life. This transformation is not random; it reflects God’s faithful provision. Just as He provides for the birds of the air and clothes the fields with beauty (Matthew 6), He also provides for us. The hymn encourages us to recognize His hand in all of creation and trust that His care extends personally into our lives.

In a world often filled with uncertainty: when gas prices soar near \$5 a gallon, tax season threatens to empty our wallets, and our daily bread seems to cost everything we have; it is all too easy to worry about tomorrow. Yet this song calls us to shift our focus. If God has the power to create and sustain the entire earth, surely, He is more than able to provide for our daily needs—our food, our strength, our peace, and our guidance.

As we step into spring, we are invited to trust more deeply. Each sunrise, each gentle breeze, and each blooming flower becomes a quiet assurance: God is our provider. When we look to Him with faith, we find not only what we need, but also a renewed sense of hope and gratitude.

Spiritual Care:

The Hidden Blessings Found in Grief

Psalm 34:18 — “The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.”

Grief is one of the most painful experiences a person can walk through, yet Scripture reveals that sorrow is not a place of abandonment but a place of encounter. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God draws near in a unique and intimate way to those who are brokenhearted. In seasons of loss, when life feels fragile and disoriented, God’s nearness becomes more than a theological idea — it becomes a lived reality.

One of the blessings found in grief is clarity. Loss strips away what is temporary and reveals what truly matters. It softens the heart, making space for compassion, humility, and deeper dependence on God. Grief also creates room for community. When we allow others into our pain, relationships deepen, and the body of Christ becomes a tangible expression of God’s comfort.

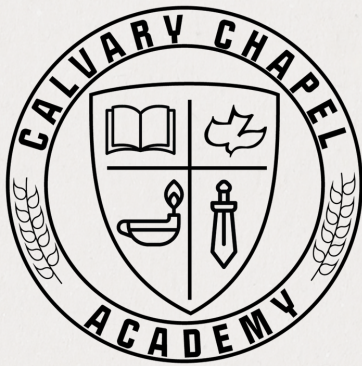

9:30 AM Service: Kids are encouraged to attend our Sunday School for all ages for the whole 9:30-10:30 AM hour. We also have childcare for infants and toddlers.

11:00 AM Service: Kids are dismissed following the songs of worship to Children's Church and Care Room

Preschool - Kindergarten Sunday School: Fruit of the Spirit (Meets upstairs in Pre-K Classroom)

Your children will continue the series, "Protected by the Armor of God". Children will see each piece of armor, in Ephesian 6, using different stories throughout the Bible.

- Shoes of Peace: Put on the Shoes of Peace. We are not afraid; Jesus gives us peace. We follow Jesus and share His peace with others. The Church sends Paul and Barnabas, Acts 13:1-5
- Shield of Faith: We have Faith in God. God protects us like a shield, and this helps our faith grow stronger. Little Ones will learn, "I can put my faith in God" Gideon defeats the Midianites, Judges 7:1-22
- Helmet of Salvation: Put on the helmet of Salvation: Know that salvation comes through Jesus only. Jesus came to save us from our sins. The story of the Crucifixion, Luke 23:31-43
- Sword of the Spirit: God's Word is the Sword of the Spirit. When we learn God's Word it helps us overcome challenges and temptations. Knowing God's Word makes me strong. The story of the Temptation of Jesus, Luke 4:1-13
- Prayer: Prayer is talking to God: We can talk to God at any time about anything! He listens and He answers us, amazing! God loves us and wants the best for us. Peter's Escape from prison, Acts 12:1-16

1st - 4th Grade Sunday School: (Downstairs Classroom)

Minor Profits uses a mining theme to help the kids explore the Minor Prophets, who wrote during a time of great upheaval and turmoil in Israel. Over the next 12 weeks the children will dig a little deeper and embrace the prospect of finding some real diamonds in the rough. Lead to Great Treasure. Memory Verse for Lessons 5-8: "The Lord has shown you what is good. He has told you what He requires of you. You must act with justice. You must show mercy. And you must be humble as you live in the sight of God" Micah 6:8

- Nahum: A Nugget of Hope: Nahum 1:1-7. The Lord's Anger. A nugget is a small piece of metal or gemstone, but that little nugget could be worth a lot. In the Book of Nahum, God has some angry words for the people of Nineveh. But as we're still left with a nugget of hope: God is still good and He is there for those who put their trust in Him. "I can always cry out to God when I am in trouble and He will hear me"
- Habakkuk: Diamond in the Rough: Habakkuk 3:13-19, Habakkuk's Prayer. Among the stone and dirt and roughness of the cave, the miner finally finds a diamond of great worth. Like many of the prophets, Habakkuk speaks about Israel's sinfulness and the consequences of such behavior. But Habakkuk also gives us a diamond- the reminder that in ALL situations and on ALL occasions, God is worthy of praise and worship. "Even when life is rough, God is worth of my praise"
- Memory Verse for lessons 9-12: "City of Zion, be full of joy! People of Jerusalem, shout! See your King comes to you. He always does what is right. He has won the victory. He is humble and riding on a donkey. He is riding on a donkey's colt." Zechariah 9:9
- Zephaniah: Shaken to the Core, Zephaniah 1:14-18, The Great Day of the Lord. Core is a long piece of rock that is drilled during diamond mining. God's words to Zephaniah about the Great Day of the Lord can shake us to the core, but they remind us that we cannot put our faith in anything of this world. We must put our Faith in God. "God is the only one who will never fail, and He is worthy of my trust!"
- Haggai: Abandoned Mine, Haggai 1:1-8, "A Call to Build God' House". In Haggai's time, the people were focused on their own desires and had abandoned putting God first. That was about as successful as mining in an abandoned mine that has no treasure left. We need to put God first, knowing that He will provide everything we need. "I will not give my leftovers to God."

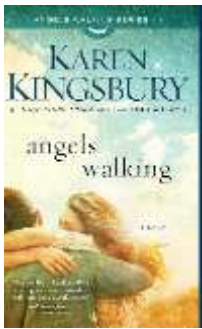
